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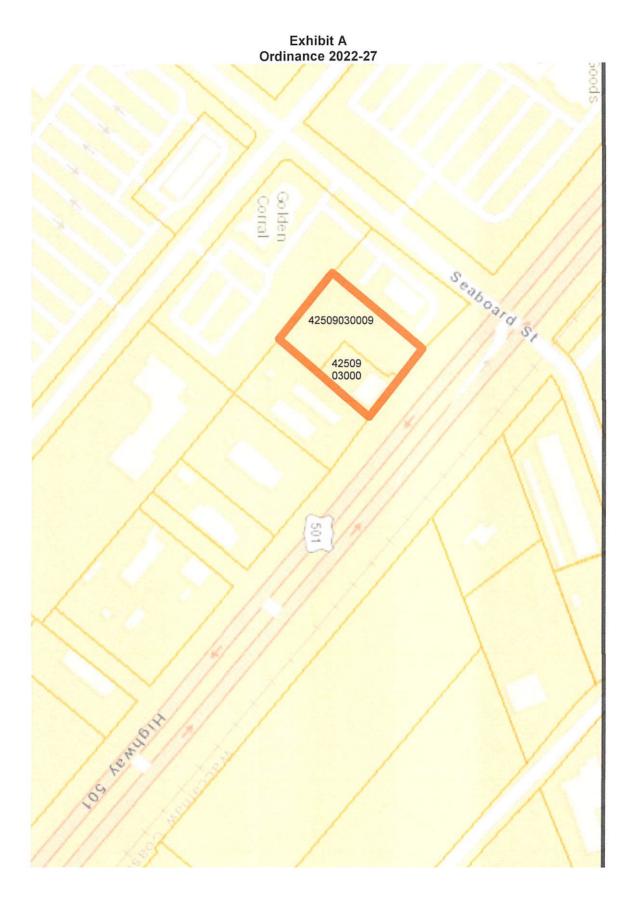

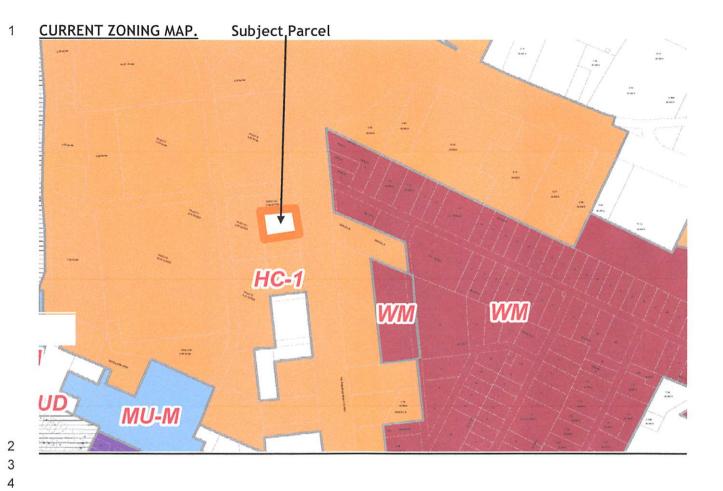

# Section 403. Findings of Fact Required

In reviewing any petition for a rezoning, the Planning Commission shall identify and evaluate all factors relevant to the petition, and shall report its findings in full, along with its recommendations for disposition of the petition, to the City Council. Factors shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

403.A. Whether or not the requested zoning change is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan or is justified by an error in the original ordinance.

16 403.B. The precedents and the possible effects of such precedents, which might result from approval or denial of the petition.

The capability of the City or other government agencies to provide any services, facilities, or programs that might be required if the petition were approved.

22 403.D. Effect of approval of the petition on the condition or value of property in the City.

24 403.E. Effect of approval of the petition on adopted development plans and policies of the City.
