




## PIN# 443-03-01-0032

# Section 403. Findings of Fact Required

In reviewing any petition for a zoning amendment, the Planning Commission shall identify and evaluate all factors relevant to the petition, and shall report its findings in full, along with its recommendations for disposition of the petition, to the City Council. 403.C. The capability of the City or other government agencies to provide any services, facilities, or programs that might be required if the petition were approved.

403.D. Effect of approval of the petition on the condition or value of property in the City.

403.E. Effect of approval of the petition on adopted development plans and policies of the City.

• Staff Comments on Findings of Fact:

• 403.A. The proposed zoning is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. No known errors in the original ordinance relating to this application were found.

• 403.B. Other similar annexations were successfully completed in the area.

• 403.C. The City is able to serve the property with water/sewer, stormwater, and emergency services.
