2021-46 (1ST READING): TO ENACT THE CITY OF MYRTLE BEACH COMPREHENSIVE PLAN 2021

<u>Applicant/Purpose:</u> City of Myrtle Beach / to meet state requirements to adopt a guide to achieve the Myrtle Beach vision:

"The City of Myrtle Beach balances the socioeconomic needs of our citizens, business owners, and visitors, connects with community roots, and grows harmoniously, capitalizing on our ideal oceanfront location to create an environment where all can live, work, and play with pride and pleasure in the best resort, business, and residential community on the East Coast."

Brief:

- South Carolina requires its municipalities to adopt a new Comprehensive Plan every 10 years. The current Myrtle Beach Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 2011.
- Previous Myrtle Beach Comprehensive Plans, although thorough, have been too cumbersome to be useful.
- In the 2021 Comp Plan, Commissioners strived to create a document that can be easily referenced by everyone.
- The 2021 Comprehensive Plan draws from other plans adopted by City Council, consolidating the goals, objectives and strategies from those plans into one comprehensive document.
- Starting in 2022, pending the end of the pandemic, Planning Commission intends to conduct public outreach in order to update one or two Comprehensive Plan elements per year for the next ten years.
- Planning Commission: Approved unanimously by Resolution on 10.5.21.

Issues:

In September 2020 South Carolina amended section 6-1-730, Code of Laws of South Carolina, relating to the expenditure of local hospitality tax revenue, so as to allow the revenue also to be used for the control and repair of flooding and drainage within or on tourism-related lands or areas, conditioned upon any local government that has a comprehensive plan due December 31, 2020, having adopted their Comprehensive Plan by December 31, 2021.
The COVID-19 pandemic limited financial resources, staffing, and effective
