WHEREAS, City Council has participated in the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program as an entitlement city since 1994 and has committed to participate with Horry County in the Horry County Urban CDBG Program; and,

WHEREAS, Horry County and the City of Myrtle Beach will hold a public hearing via teleconference on April 13, 2021 regarding the 2021/2022 CDBG Annual Action Plan to receive input from citizens on the needs of the community and to explain the proposed uses of CDBG funds within the City. The Horry County Citizen Participation Plan has been the guide to citizen participation and the planning process; and

WHEREAS, Horry County has provided an estimate of the amount of the 2021/2022 CDBG funds and County staff has requested that the City plan for an allocation of \$405,014. Any additional funding provided by HUD or funding shortfall shall be added or subtracted as appropriate from the Housing Acquisition line item in the budget.

## IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that:

- 1. The City Council hereby adopts the CDBG budget listed below for inclusion in the Horry County Urban CDBG Program for FY 2021/2022.
- 2. In the event that additional revenues are provided or revenues reduced by HUD, or if some activity item expenses are less or more than itemized on this budget, the City Manager has the authority to add the revenues or reduce the revenues as appropriate within the Housing Acquisition project account.
- 3. The City Manager shall have the authority to make any change equal to or less than 25% of the project budget amounts for the projects. Any adjustment of more than 25% of the project budget amount for projects requires approval by the City Council.
- 4. Any adjustment to the project budgets listed below is subject to the approval of the Horry County CDBG Office acting in their capacity as Administrators of the Horry County Urban CDBG Program.
